

Local Government Brings Inclusivity to Community Meetings with Wordly



Challenge

Bringing inclusivity to a diverse community

About 40% of Modesto's population is Hispanic, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Many people in the community speak Spanish, along with other languages. After hearing concerns from the diverse community of Modesto, city council began searching for solutions.

"Some of the solutions in the beginning was providing more people at the Council meetings that spoke other languages like Spanish," Douglass said. "But all the while we were searching for a more consistent solution that was technology-based."

They were looking for a service that allows residents to read / listen to city presentations in other languages at live meetings so everyone can participate. They wanted to provide a consistent solution for the community that was technology-based and did not require people to make special requests before each meeting. They also wanted a solution that worked for in-person and virtual meeting attendees.




Solution

AI-powered translation and captions

Modesto selected Wordly, an AI-powered live translation and caption solution. The Wordly AI-powered translation platform provides real-time translated captioning and audio to meeting participants, enabling members of the local community who don't speak English the opportunity to participate in city council meetings. The solution also promotes transparency and engagement between city management and residents.

"It's a cloud-based service we run through Zoom and it connects to this third-party service," Douglass said. "It essentially pushes the audio to this other service, and they take that audio that's in English in this case, and then it provides the option for translation."





Wordly interprets from English plus 50 other international languages into 60+ different languages and is designed to promote transparency and engagement between city management and residents. Each participant can select their own language and listen to live translated audio or read captions on their own phone, tablet, or computer. The translation and captions are accessed through a QR code or website that gives participants the ability to choose their preferred language during the meetings.

Implementation

Fast and easy implementation

The city spent three months testing and preparing Wordly for public use. A brief summary of the implementation plan is provided below:

Phase 1: Configuration - 1 Week


 Modesto worked with Wordly to configure the Wordly system, including Zoom integration


Phase 2: Testing - 12 Weeks

- Created testing scripts and meeting scenarios
- Tested various languages, computer platforms, and browsers

Phase 3: Go Live - 4 Weeks

- Soft release
- Engaged community groups
- User surveys
- Advertised new capability on website, at meetings, and with a press release

"A lot of other cities are using people to do that service and most of them are doing that on a request basis," Douglass said. "We wanted to be able to make this a consistent thing that we could do for our community."
